The Sukkot tour of 2025 will be a special one. Our last tour ended on October 7th, 2023, and because of that day, no one who loves the Land of Israel will ever be the same. The Sukkot tour of 2025 will be our

declaration, like Joshua and Caleb, that the Land is a good land, and it will supply our every need if we have faith in the One Who promised it to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

An act of faith in coming to the Land of Israel takes a lot of natural resources, but our Father will pour out from His infinite spiritual wealth. EXPERIENCE ISRAEL

Some of our Sukkot experience will be in the desert (Arava) of Israel, at Biblical Tamar Park, but you will have time to walk the ancient streets of Jerusalem, visit the Western Wall, the Temple Mount, the Mount of Olives, and many other historic places. The Galilee tour will introduce you to the historic places Yeshua walked and the beautiful Sea.

You will also enjoy many leisure hours studying and meditating on the things of God. Biblical Tamar Park is enclosed in the immense southern Israel Nature Reserve, where over 100,000 acres are available for you to explore, and where you can go to such places as Mt. Hor, where Moses buried Aaron, where Moses smote the Rock, and where the children of Israel wandered in the wilderness. Tamar is the biblical site of Oboth as written in Numbers. It is also near Bozrah and Petra in Jordan.

This itinerary is subject to change at any time for any reason depending of the conditions and unforeseen issues that may arise while we are in Israel.

You can stay longer and volunteer at the Park at a daily cost of only \$40 per night for board and room. We invite you to stay longer and bless Israel by working physically on the Land. Contact Jodi at info@blossomingrose.org for more details.

TOUR ITINERARY

Day 1: Sunday – 5th - Flights to Israel



Flights leave the US to arrive in Israel the next day. Please arrive four hours early to take an international flight.

Day 2: Monday – 6th – Erev Sukkot – Jerusalem



After arriving at Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv, you will meet our Blossoming Rose group at 6pm to board the tour bus. By the time we reach the hotel, Sukkot will have begun. We will eat dinner together at the hotel in Jerusalem and rest after having a long journey.

Day 3: Tuesday - 7th - Yom Tov - Sukkot Day One - Jerusalem



After breakfast at the hotel, we will crossover the Valley of Gehinnom to enter the Zion Gate to the Old City of Jerusalem. As a festival Shabbat, the shops will be closed, but the city will be alive with people celebrating the feast. We will leisurely explore a few areas of the Jewish Quarter and make our way up to the Kotel. Everyone will have an opportunity to reflect

and pray without needing to rush. After sunset and dinner at the hotel, you will be able to shop and enjoy more feast activities at your leisure on Ben Yehudah Street.

<u>Day 4: Wednesday – 8th</u> - Sukkot Day Two – National Archaeology Museum, Western Wall Tunnels, and City of David - Jerusalem



After an early breakfast at the hotel, we will visit the National Archaeological Museum of the Land of Israel, which is the new home of The Israel Antiquities Authority. Then, we will return to the Old City for a tour of the Western Wall Tunnel. The tunnel allows visitors to reach the segments of the Wall hidden from view and a walk through archeological findings, such as large stone arches, water pits, and an ancient water

aqueduct that ends at the Strouthion Pool. We will spend the rest of the afternoon in the City of David before heading back to our hotel for dinner and rest.

Day 5: Thursday - 9th - Sukkot Day Three - Bet Hoglah, Beit She'an, Tabor Winery - Tiberias



After an early breakfast at the hotel, we will pack up and head to the plains of Jericho to Bet Hoglah, the area near where Israel first crossed over into the Promised Land. From there, we will go north to historic Beit She'an to view some of the best-preserved ruins in Israel. From there, you can see nearby Mount Gilboa where king Saul and three of his sons were defeated by the Philistines. Before heading to our hotel in Tiberius, we will stop by Tabor Winery,

which sits at the foot of Mount Tabor. There you can take in the iconic views, taste, or shop.

Afterwards, we will make our way to the hotel for dinner and rest. You will have the evening free to shop, rest, or even charter a boat ride on the Kinneret/Galilee.

Day 6: Friday – 10th - Sukkot Day Four – Tabgha, Tzfat, Chorazin – Tiberias



We will start our day by visiting Tabgha, also known as Ein Sheva (Seven Springs), which is situated on the banks of the Sea of Galilee at the foot of the Mount of Beatitudes. Traditionally, this is where Messiah multiplied the loaves and fish. Then, we will head to Tzfat (Safed) to view the Galilee from the Citadel, the highest point of Israel's highest city. This peak is one

of the places ancient Israel lit signal fires announcing new months/moons. Known for mysticism and art, we will tour this ancient city. There, we will have lunch and have opportunities to shop. On our way back to the hotel, we will visit Korazim (Chorazin) to explore the ruins of this ancient village, which includes the remains of a synagogue, a residential area, and a ritual bath. You will have free time in the evening rest or join Shabbat and Sukkot festivities in Tiberias.

Day 7: Saturday – 11th - Sukkot Day Five – Shabbat in the Galilee - Tiberias



After a leisurely breakfast provided by the hotel, we will gather for Shabbat prayers, Torah reading, and a teaching in one of the hotel's meeting rooms. Lunch will be served at the hotel, and later you will have the option to eat dinner out after sunset or enjoy another buffet style meal at the hotel.

Day 8: Sunday – 12th - Sukkot Day Six – Megiddo, Caesarea, Old Jaffa (Joppa/Yafo) - Biblical Tamar Park



After an early breakfast at the hotel, we will pack up and head to Megiddo National Park and view the Jezreel Valley from the top of the tel. From there, we will drive to the Mediterranean coast to view the largest ancient port city in Israel, Caesarea, which was built by King Herod. There, you can explore the remains of Herod's palace, the Roman theater, the hippodrome, the aqueduct, and the harbor. Then, staying along the Mediterranean, we will visit another ancient port city,

Yafo or Joppa where Jonah found a ship going to Tarshish as he fled from the LORD (Jon. 1:3), and see the likely place where Peter received the vision of the sheet (Acts 10). Later, we will make our way to the Arava desert to Biblical Tamar Park, our home away from home in Israel. We will welcome the Sabbath with the lovely volunteers of the park and then sit in the sukkah for fellowship.

Day 9: Monday – 13th - Sukkot Day Seven – Qumran, Kalia Beach – Tamar Park



After breakfast at the Park, we will spend the day along the Dead Sea, stopping first at Qumran to explore the archeological site's excavations of the area where the enigmatic Essene sect lived and where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. There, you can also eat and shop before we head to nearby Kalia Beach on the Dead Sea. Kalia offers more restaurants and shopping, scenic

views, and a large beach area where you can relax, float on the salty sea, or cover yourself in its healing, mineral rich mud. Dinner will be provided by the volunteers at Biblical Tamar Park as we enter into Yom Tov.

<u>Day 10: Tuesday – 14th - Sukkot Day Eight – Shemini Atzeret – Simcha Torah – Yom Tov –</u> <u>Tamar</u>



We will spend the Eighth Day together at Biblical Tamar Park. All meals will be served in the fellowship hall. A more detailed itinerary of this day will be provided later.

<u>Day 11: Wednesday – 15th</u> - En Gedi Kibbutz Botanical Garden, En Gedi Nature Reserve, Masada - Tamar



After an early breakfast at the park, we will head to the beautiful Botanical Gardens of En Gedi. Afterwards, we will go to the nature reserve, where King David took refuge from Saul and penned many of the Psalms. You can hike to one of the cascading waterfalls, view the abundant wildlife, and take in amazing views of the Dead Sea. Later, we will visit Masada National Park with its rich history and archaeology including King Herod's northern palace, built on three rock terraces overlooking the gorge below.

We will return to Tamar for dinner and rest.

Day 12: Thursday – 16th – Timna Park, Eilat - Gulf of Aqaba, Tamar Park



After another early breakfast at the park, we will head to the southern tip of Israel where the majestic waters of the Gulf of Aqaba in the Red Sea touch four countries: Israel, Jordan, Egypt, and Saudia Arabia. Along the way, we will visit some of the highlights in Timna National Park where some the world's oldest copper mines have been found.

Beautiful red sandstone rock formations such as Solomon's Pillars, the Mushroom, and the Arches will make for excellent photo opportunities, and walking through a guided tour of the full-size replica of the Tabernacle is spiritually moving. Afterwards, we will visit Eilat where you will have time to eat, shop, or even take a dip in the Gulf of Aqaba. We will return to Tamar for dinner and rest.

<u>Day 13: Friday – 17th</u> – Miriam's Spring & Scorpion's Ascent, Vidor Center, Tamar Park



After an early breakfast we will take the bus down the road to hike to Miriam's Spring in the Wilderness of Zin and view Ma'ale Akrabbim (Scorpion's Ascent) from the vantage point of the wadi. This ancient winding road is along the old spice route connecting the Negev to the Arava. Dr. Alewine will teach us about the fascinating history of this area,

which inspired her soon to be released novel, <u>Scorpion's Ascent</u>. Then, we will visit the nearby Vidor Agriculture Center for an interactive learning experience about the history, geology, desert agriculture, and people living in the Arava. We will enter Shabbat with another wonderful dinner provided by the volunteers at Biblical Tamar Park followed by one final night under the Sukkah.

<u>Day 14: Saturday – 18th</u> – Shabbat – Biblical Tamar Park – Ben Gurion Airport



After a leisurely breakfast, we will gather for prayer, Torah readings, and one final message from Dr. Alewine. After lunch, you will have time to rest before packing and preparing for our departure. In the late afternoon, the bus will take us back to Tel Aviv to Ben Gurion Airport for return flights home.

Day 15: Sunday – 19th – Flights Home
